School Meals at No Charge for All Children

Effective immediately, Botetourt County will continue serving meals at no charge to children 18 and under. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has approved waivers for local school divisions and other federal meal program sponsors who implement the Summer Food Service Program to provide meals to children in the community free of charge **through the end of the scheduled school year**. The waivers support access to nutritious meals while minimizing exposure to COVID-19.

Meals are available to all children including those learning in-person and those learning virtually and regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

Although applications are **NOT** required for school meals being provided free to all children as mentioned above, a new meal application must be completed each school year if you have not already been notified that your student is approved for free/reduced meals. School funding depends on completed meal applications for families who wish to take advantage of free/reduced eligibility in a normal school year. It is important to submit a completed meal application as soon as possible, to prevent delays through anticipated transition back to a typical meal service model.
